Resident Rights - What it Looks Like -

-Each resident has the right to choose a personal attending physician and be fully informed in advance in language that the resident understands about care and treatment or any changes in such that may affect the resident's well-being. Each resident not adjudged incompetent also has the right to participate in the planning of and changes in the resident's total care and medical treatment and to make choices based upon the information provided.

What it Looks Like-

- "You may choose your personal physician"
- " You should be informed about your care and treatment in language you understand."
- "Anyone who is competent may participate in the planning of and any changes in your total care including medical treatment." Based on this information you can make informed choices about your care.
- "You are invited and encouraged to participate in care conferences along with your family members."



SAFETY TIPS

get outside quickly.

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom. They should also be outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. Install alarms in the basement.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms.
 When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month.
 Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Current alarms on the market employ different types of technology including multi-sensing, which could include smoke and carbon monoxide combined.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions, yet mitigate false alarms.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet (3 meters) from the stove.
- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.

FACTS

- A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level. Smoke alarms should be connected so when one sounds, they all sound. Most homes do not have this level of protection.
- Roughly 3 out of 5 fire deaths happen in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

Moist Carmel Apple Cake

What You Need

1 pkg. Yellow Cake Mix

1 pkg. Jell-O Instant vanilla pudding

1 Cup water

4 Eggs

1/3 Cup Oil

1/4 Cup Milk

3 Apples peeled, coarsely chopped

20 Kraft Caramels

3 TBS. Milk

Make it

Heat oven to 350 F.

Beat first 6 ingredients in large bowl with mixer until blended. Stir in chopped apples. Pour into greased and floured 12 cup fluted Bundt pan.
Bake 50 minutes to 1 hour. Cool cake in pan 15 minutes. Invert on wire rack. Cool completely.

Transfer to plate.

Microwave caramels and milk in microwave bowl on high 1-1 1/2 minutes or until caramels are melted and sauce is smooth. Cool until thickened. Drizzle over cake just before serving.


